

# The Presque Isle Free High School

The Presque Isle Free High School deservedly ranks with the best schools of its class. Its situation is on a slightly elevation on one of the principal streets of the thriving and attractive village of Presque Isle. It occupies a spacious, airy and well-ventilated apartment in the public school building, built some years since, and conceded by all who have examined it to be one of the best arranged and best equipped school buildings in the state. This fine structure is heated throughout by steam and supplied with the best modern appliances for drainage and ventilation.

The High School room proper has a seating capacity of 120 pupils. The attendance at the present time comprises 90 pupils and the instruction and discipline of the school are of the highest order.

The High School is excellently equipped with modern appliances for work in the natural sciences, geological specimens, and with all kinds of school apparatus of a miscellaneous character.

The school curriculum embraces three regular courses, the Classical, the English and the English-Classical in which there is offered the pupil the best advantages of instruction in each department. The Classical course furnishes the student a thorough preparation for beginning a college course, and within the past year arrangements have been made by which graduates from the Presque Isle High School are admitted to Bates College without examination.

The English course is designed to give pupils the best instruction in both the common and higher English branches, while the English Classical course is designed to broaden the instruction given in the English course. There is at present a Lyceum maintained by the pupils of the school which is in a flourishing condition, and proving to be a very positive source of interest and improvement.
